- Australia has supported Vanuatu Government and VPF efforts on this project since concerns were first raised about the structural integrity of the Central Station in 2018. This support has included:
 - initial testing on the building which informed the vacation of all officers in 2021
 - infrastructure to support VPF's initiative to decentralise officers to urban posts, such as Freswota and Nambatri,
 - assisting with temporary facilities to ensure continued service delivery over this period
 - and now, the design and construction of a new purpose-built facility.
- The new Port Vila Police Station is designed to meet the needs of the VPF and the community now, and into the future.
- Once complete, the new station will allow the consolidation of the VPF's
 Southern Command into a secure and appropriately planned site
 - and will assist the VPF to enhance collaboration, sharing of resources, and improve cross functionality.
- To align with VPF growth projections, the new station will have the capacity to house approximately 165 VPF personnel
 - future proofing the policing needs of the Port Vila community.



- The design is informed by consultations across the VPF, including with female police officers,
 - as well as with community stakeholders such as the Vanuatu Women's Centre and Vanuatu Society for People with Disabilities,
 - to ensure that the new station also promotes inclusion
 - and supports a police force that reflects the diversity of the people it serves.
- Police play an incredibly important role in our community to keep people safe and maintain order
 - community safety is not just about reducing crime,
 - safe communities allow community members to reach their full potential and contribute to society
 - strengthening community safety is about building strong, vibrant, cohesive and participatory communities for all.
